

ORDINANCE 1974- (13)

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THAT GASOLINE SERVICE STATIONS, OPEN TO THE PUBLIC, SHALL HAVE AN ATTENDANT OR SUPERVISOR ON DUTY WHENEVER THE STATION IS OPEN FOR BUSINESS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN
OF THE CITY OF PETAL, MISSISSIPPI:

Section 1: Supervisor or attendant required.

All gasoline service stations, requiring a license to operate and requiring a privilege tax license and open to the public, shall have an attendant or supervisor on duty whenever the station is open for business.

Section 2: Violation of ordinance provisions.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, unless otherwise stated, or permitting another to violate this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$300.00, or imprisoned not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Such fine and imprisonment shall be in addition to any other penalty imposed by any particular section of this ordinance or applicable provision of State Law.

Section 3: Effective date.

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Petal, Mississippi, having determined that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance should go into effect immediately, it shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

The foregoing ordinance having been reduced to writing, the same was introduced and read and a vote was taken thereon, first section by section, then upon the ordinance as

a whole with the following results:


